



Located in the Grand Est region, Metz Eurometropole is European in essence. 1 hour from Luxembourg and Germany, 3 hours from Brussels and just 85 minutes from Paris, all roads lead to Metz! Whether you're travelling by car (via the A4 or the A31), by train (arriving at

Metz Ville station or Lorraine TGV station), or by boat (via the Canal de l'Est, the Moselle or the Sarre), Metz is a must. By air, in addition to Lorraine Airport, check out the flight connections to Luxembourg airport (45 minutes away) and Saarbrücken airport (1 hour away).

A Michelin-starred chef

The Centre Pompidou-Metz welcomes Michelin-starred chef Charles Coulombeau for a new gastronomic adventure.

Scheduled to open on 5 June 2024, the restaurant promises a unique experience, combining the flavours of French gastronomy and Japanese culinary art. In this exceptional setting, the chef has come up with not one but two restaurants: a French-Japanese Brasserie, for lunch in the large dining room seating around a hundred, and a gastronomic restaurant for dinner in the glass bubble for around twenty guests.

Centre Pompidou-Metz and Saint Etienne's Cathedral

You'll be amazed by the unusual architecture of the **Centre Pompidou-Metz**, with its hexagonal roof resembling the wickerwork of a Chinese hat, which is lit up from within after dark. The building itself is a work of art!

In 2024, this exceptional space for discovering modern and contemporary artistic creation will offer unique opportunities to contemplate and explore masterpieces of art history, such as Courbet's L'Origine du Monde, which is being presented to coincide with Lacan, the exhibition. When Art Meets Psychoanalysis until 27.05.2024.

A retrospective on a key figure in surrealism will be presented in the spring with André Masson. There is no finished world, while a monumental immersive work by Katharina Grosse will unfold in the Grande Nef from 01.06.24 to 14.02.25 and will spill out onto the museum forecourt.

Finally, from 13.07 to 18.11, SEE/ TIME/ IN COLOUR, The challenges of photography will take a look at the history of this medium in the light of the proliferation of digital images.

Musée de la Cour d'Or - Metz Eurometropole

Musée de la Cour d'Or - Metz Eurometropole and FRAC

Climb the hill to visit the Musée de la Cour d'Or - Eurométropole de Metz, and its maze of dark corridors leading to an altar dedicated to Mithras, master of the winds and friend of the sun, a medieval attic, or magnificent and unique medieval painted ceilings.

Carry on to the town's oldest civil building, the beautiful residence where Charles V was invited, which houses the **FRAC** (Regional Fund for Contemporary Art).

Place Saint-Louis and the Outre-Seille district

Go back down to Place Saint-Louis, where the money-changers worked on stone benches during the time of the Metz Republic, and into the Outre-Seille district with its medieval charm to admire Cocteau's stained-glass windows in Saint Maximin's church or visit the Porte des Allemands, a small fortified castle spanning the Seille, where you can see traces of former battles, and admire exhibitions and artistic performances.

In the Eurometropole, don't miss the House of Robert Schuman, Father of Europe, in Scy-Chazelles, Museum of the War of 1870 and the Annexation, situated on the site of the terrible fighting that gave rise to the local rain-linked expression «it's falling like Gravelotte», or the Château de Courcelles in Montigny-lès-Metz, built in the 18th century and today, an exhibition space.

You'll probably be wondering about the **ancient aqueduct** on the banks of the Moselle (at Ars-sur-Moselle): it carried spring water to Metz and dates back to the 2nd century!








Moselle Open

In summer and winter alike, there are a thousand and one ways to enjoy Metz together! The first notes of music at a concert, the kick-off of a match, a hot-air balloon taking off over the water, the mapping of light effects on the cathedral... so many opportunities to enjoy a unique experience with the people of Metz.

Moselle is a "Terre de Jeux 2024" and the Eurometropole has 5 sites and facilities that can host delegations in Olympic and Paralympic disciplines such as artistic and rhythmic gymnastics, handball, judo, trampoline, rowing, slalom canoeing, table tennis, etc.

There's nothing like a match or competition to get you in the mood and feel connected:

- with the Dragonnes (Metz Handball), who have an impressive track record: 25 French Championships, 11 French Cups, 8 League Cups, 2 Final Fours;
- at the **Saint Symphorien Stadium**, where the South Stand has just been completely refurbished with new areas for FC Metz;
- at the **Moselle Open**, which will be held for the 21st time in 2024 at Metz Arènes, one of the four ATP 250 tennis tournaments in France, with a host of prestigious players;
- at the Mirabelle d'Or International Open at the Grange-aux-Ormes golf course, part of the Alps Tour circuit, with over 100 professional players taking part;



Metz, a sporting city

The people of Metz will have the honour of welcoming the Olympic flame on 27 June to spread the energy of sport and teamwork. In Moselle for a day, the flame will criss-cross the department, from Sarreguemines to Metz, via the House of Robert Schuman in Scy-Chazelles. It will end its journey in the city of Metz, where 24 people will form a guard of honour, and will remain there for the evening, which will be packed with entertainment on Place de la République.


The Constellations de Metz International Festival lights up the summer!

Building on the success of the 2023 edition, which welcomed over a million visitors, the Constellations de Metz International Festival returns from 20 June to 31 August 2024 with the Digital Stones night-time trail and the Art & Gardens day-time trail on the common theme of «Free Space (s)». The rich and varied programme is rounded off by a number of large-scale urban art projects.

Now in its 8th year, the festival continues to explore and promote the heritage of the city of Metz, inspiring contemporary creation and offering a fresh look at its natural and urban space. Constellations de Metz has become a major free cultural event and a must-see on the national and cross-border scene. It has set the standard for Metz's cultural and tourist life, and its influence extends beyond the city itself. The festival is accentuating its international dimension by inviting international artists and various European co-productions, while at the same time focusing on a number of regional and local artists.

The Mirabelle Plum Festival and Hot air balloons

The traditional Mirabelle Plum Festival, a key ecoresponsible event during the cultural summer in Metz, will be bringing the city's unspoilt natural sites to life from 22 to 25 August 2024. A programme combining iconic highlights and new features awaits Metz residents and tourists in a friendly, gourmet and festive atmosphere. Come and celebrate the local produce and the golden fruit by attending the concerts and entertainment at the Mirabelle Guinquette on the Esplanade de Metz, the flavours and arts market, the original plum tart competition, and the evening crowning of the 2024 Mirabelle Queen at the Arsenal. On 25 August, echoing the Olympic Games, the water parade on the lake will resound with its sporting, cultural and social dimension, with Olympic values at its heart.

Hot air balloons - Metz

To extend the festivities, Hot Air balloons will take to the skies above Metz from the Lake. Organised by the Moselle Hot-air Balloon Pilots Association, they offer walkers a poetic, soothing and colourful spectacle at dawn or dusk. Everyone can try their hand at water sports or admire a light parade during the Water Festival.

Further along, the romantic Regatta Gardens and Swan Lake, embellished by dancing fountains, are the ideal backdrop for music and light displays which are held every evening during the summer weekends (every Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Sunday and eves of public holidays at 10.30 p.m. and 11 p.m.).







Christmas Market and Saint Nicholas Festivities

Winter is warmed up by the Christmas market, ranked 3rd in the "Best Christmas markets 2024" competition organised by European Best Destination, and 1st in the "Family" category.

As the festive season approaches and the Christmas Market comes to life in various parts of the city, at the start of December, it is traditional for **Saint Nicholas** to reward well-behaved children with sweets and treats, while Père Fouettard takes care of the less well-behaved ones.

Shops and businesses are generally open on the 4 Sundays before Christmas, so you can enjoy city breaks to the scent of spice right up until the last days.

Ferris wheels and other winter games offer a wide range of leisure activities for young and old alike.







The Arsenal Jean-Marie Rausch, renovated by Ricardo Bofill, is home to one of Europe's finest concert halls, with its sumptuous décor of beech and sycamore.



Trinitaires - Metz

Saint-Pierre-aux-Nonnains, one of the oldest churches in France, hosts early music concerts and exhibitions.

Les Trinitaires, a former Carmelite convent, has been hosting concerts in this unique atmosphere since the 1970s.

As for the **BAM**, which celebrates its 10th anniversary from 26 to 28 September, the architectural project dedicated to contemporary music is the work of Rudy Ricciotti, which is a promise in itself.

Opéra-Théâtre - Metz Eurometropole

At the Opéra-Théâtre, the oldest opera house in France still running, an 18th century jewel with an unusual history (from an unscrupulous architect to its sculptures and inscriptions), you can attend operas, comedies, ballets, operettas and dramas with new productions and creations in collaboration with major national and international bodies.

A new chandelier, created by the Centre International d'Art Verrier de Meisenthal (CIAV), has been illuminating the Opéra-Théâtre's hall since November 2023. The 34 pearl-shaped glass globes represent a necklace.

For example, on the **banks of the Moselle** in front of the Temple Neuf, or, more intimately, at the **Récollets cloister** in the heart of the city, in the **medicinal plant garden**. Walks and gardens

Walks and gardens are as important to the city's structure as the streets: in the Jardins Jean-Marie Pelt (Parc de la Seille), the Graoully footbridge provides access to the Queuleu district, and the forecourt of the Palais Omnisport Les Arenes. The Botanical gardens connect Metz and the south of the Eurometropole with their collection greenhouses, rose garden and water features.

Do as the people of Metz do, take a seat on a bench and enjoy lunch in the ephemeral garden on Place de la Comédie or in the French formal gardens on the Esplanade, listen to the whisper of the water fountains. A haven of peace just off the pedestrianised streets and lively Place de la République.

Walking and cycling routes

Make the most of the opportunity to follow the suggested routes along the canalised or wild River Moselle, on foot or by bike along the Voie Bleue (V50), and discover the lock keeper's house, the Parc de la Cavalerie, the Ile du Saulcy, or the descent of the Pucelle. You can even watch the kayakers in action! As a family, you'll find plenty of places for your little ones to play.

The Botanical Garden is a place rich in human and plant history. Located in the town of Montigny-lès-Metz for over 150 years, it invites walkers to retrace the journey of plants through the various collections of temperate and tropical plants. Remarkable trees, rock gardens, rose gardens, scent gardens, equatorial undergrowth and arid environments in the greenhouses are all represented. A truly bucolic area to spend a peaceful moment or discover botanical curiosities.

If you're feeling brave, you can even cycle the Pays Messin wine route* (46 km) through winegrowing villages, past orchards and vineyards, discovering AOC-labelled estates and the Moselle valley. Pinot noir, pinot gris, auxerrois, Müller-Thurgau, pinot blanc, gewürztraminer or gamay are ideal with quiche, pie, stew

and Mirabelle plums! The Mirabelle has been a favourite of the people of Metz since the 16th century: we celebrate it every year, visit the orchards, eat it in tartes, whole, in eau-de-vie or liqueur - you just can't miss it! Cooking lessons, cellar tours, beer-themed treasure hunts - there's something for everyone.




